



All Students Eat Free of Charge!

The Community Education Building (CEB) is pleased to participate in the National School Lunch Program and (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP) and Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP). Meals will be available to all children set by Federal guidelines. The CEB will participate in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) starting 2015 school year. To qualify, a district or school must have 40 percent or more of its students eligible for free meals based on direct certification. Through CEP, all students in the CEB at no charge to all students. This eliminates the procedure of distributing and processing meal applications which benefits all families and assures healthy, balanced meals for all students!

Non-Discrimination Statement
